The Village Board appointed Juliana Maller as Village Manager effective August 20<sup>th</sup>.

Juliana Maller comes from the City of Park Ridge, where she served as Acting City Manager. Ms. Maller had been the Deputy City Manager for Park Ridge since

1996. She also served as the Assistant to the City Administrator of West Chicago from 1991-1996.

Juliana holds a Master’s Degree in Public Administration from Northern Illinois University and a Bachelor’s Degree in Public Administration and Political Science from Augustana College.


# Fire Department Host Fire Prevention Week Open House - Saturday, October 13<sup>th</sup>

Hanover Park Fire Department will be hosting its Annual Open House at Fire Station No. 1 located at 6850 Barrington Road from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. The day will be filled with demonstrations and displays from area community organizations. Demonstrations will include vehicle extrication and the State Police vehicle seatbelt simulator.

Station tours will run throughout the day, and Fire Department personnel will be on hand to answer any questions you may have. Firefighters will also be showing off the engines, tower ladder, and ambulances.

Children will be able to dress up in firefighting bunker gear and experience what it is like to be a firefighter.

The ICash Program, formerly called "Cash Dash," is an Illinois State Treasurer's Unclaimed Property Division that connects state residents with their unclaimed property. This program was established with the goal of helping Illinois residents through the process of reclaiming money or assets.

**"One in eight Illinois residents has an asset to be claimed in ICash."**

This database, managed by Treasurer Dan Rutherford's office, added 780,000 additional residents to the public web database, after the state double-checked claims from years 1976 - 1992.

The Treasurer is required to hold all unclaimed property and money in a vault in Springfield. Residents may see if they have any unclaimed assets by visiting the ICash website at [www.icash.illinois.gov](http://www.icash.illinois.gov)

- Have a flashlight or reflector.

## Acceptable Items for Recycling Are:

- Clean, usable child and adult clothing
- Household office equipment and household electronic items (such as computers and monitors, TVs, VCRs, stereos, microwave ovens, cameras, video game equipment, and so on; see the Village Web site for a complete list). All electronic items are recycled; none are resold or sent to organizations for re-use.
- Personal documents for shredding (service is free; limited to three boxes total. No businesses. No hard covers, binders, binder clips, or books. Staples and paperclips OK)
- Large lead-acid batteries (automobile, sump pump, SLA, and marine batteries only)
- Household batteries
- Eye glasses, hearing aids, and keys
- CFL bulbs
- Bicycles and wheelchairs (in working, usable condition)
- Motor oil and antifreeze
- Holiday lights and extension cords
- Scrap metal
- Fire extinguishers
- Cell phones and ink-jet cartridges
- Prescription and over-the-counter drugs (black-out all prescription label information): also includes medicated ointments and shampoos, liquids containing medication, prescription and over-the-counter inhalers, glass thermometers and other instruments that contain mercury

**Unacceptable items include:** Paint, large appliances (such as refrigerators and ovens), air conditioners, water heaters, oil filters, garbage disposals, propane tanks, compressed air tanks, smoke detectors, radioactive materials, ammunition, explosives, hazardous waste, chemicals, business waste of any kind, regular garbage.

## Public Works

### Water Conservation

With the recent water increases, here are some ways to conserve water and save money.

#### Inside the Home

The bathroom is where three-quarters of all indoor residential water use occurs, try the following:

#### Toilets

Repair toilet leaks promptly. A leaking flapper valve in the bottom of your toilet tank can waste 600 gallons a month.

Newer toilets use less water to flush. To make old toilets more efficient, fill a couple of plastic bottles with water and screw on the caps. Place the bottles in the toilet tank (out of the way of any moving parts) and your toilet will consume less water potentially saving 10 or more gallons each day.

#### Showers

Limit your shower to 5 minutes or less, and save hundreds of gallons each month. To save even more, install a low-flow shower head.

#### Sinks

Do not let the water run while brushing your teeth (or shaving). This saves up to four gallons a minute (that is up to 200 gallons a week for a family of four).

You can also save hundreds of gallons by running the dishwasher and the washing machine only when you have full loads.

#### Outside the Home Cars

Car washing uses a huge amount of water. Many commercial car wash facilities re-cycle and re-use water. If you wash your car at home, use the hose for rinsing only. Make sure your hose has a nozzle for shutting off the water while you wash, and you will save 100 or more gallons.

#### Driveways and Sidewalks

Clean driveways and sidewalks with a broom, not a hose.

#### Lawns

Lawn maintenance consumes thousands of gallons. Lawn sprinkling should occur only when needed and not during the middle of the day, to reduce loss due to evaporation. When you run the sprinkler, make sure to deep-soak your lawn to get water down to the roots. A light sprinkling mostly evaporates and does not benefit the lawn.

How do you deep-soak the lawn? Place an empty tuna can on the lawn, and stop the sprinklers when the can is full.

## IRVING PARK ROAD CORRIDOR STUDY



ULI holds Reception for Irving Pk Rd businesses & residents



CONNECT Committee & CMAP meet with Irving Pk Rd Businesses

This summer, we took a closer look at the Irving Park Road Corridor to learn about how businesses and the Village can work together to improve the area. With the help of a grant from the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP), the Village worked with the Urban Land Institute (ULI) to conduct an Irving Park Road Corridor Study.

A technical assistance panel gathered for two days to evaluate the corridor and brainstorm on ideas for improvement. The project provided a unique opportunity to get advice from a dozen notable real estate, development, architecture, business, and finance professionals. They interviewed over 50 residents, businesses, property owners, and community organizations to learn about what is going on in the area. They took into account feedback from over 30 residents and 20 businesses from past community meetings. Thanks to all who participated!

They recommended ways in which a better business climate can be created in the area, through means such as:


- Improved business-to-business communication and coordination
- Support for small businesses and community facilities
- Streetscape Improvements, such as sidewalks and lighting
- Increased connections between Irving Park Road and surrounding neighborhoods

These recommendations will be used to develop programs and policies in the Village over the coming year.

Following a series of public meetings, Village regulations for the parking of commercial vehicles in residential areas have been updated.

### Under new regulations:

- Vehicles with a 'D' classification (8,000-12,000 lbs.) are permitted to be parked in residential areas, with certain restrictions.
- Certain types of specialized commercial vehicles, such as box trucks and dump trucks, are not permitted unless making a delivery or performing work.
- Equipment or commercial material stored in a commercial vehicle must be completely enclosed by a manufactured cover.
- Public passenger vehicles, other than taxis or limos, are not permitted to be parked in residential areas overnight.


