Parkway Tree Planting Program



Have you had a dead Ash tree removed from your parkway or simply want a tree? The Village is following an economically sound and healthy forestry plan, which will replace your parkway tree in the next several years. In order to provide a more diverse tree population, we will be planting one of twenty varieties.

If you would like to replace your tree sooner, at your own cost, you can do so by participating in the Village's Parkway Tree Planting Program. If interested in qualifying for this program, contact Public Works at 630.823.5700 or sweber@hpil.org. All requests must have an approved parkway review before an order will be placed. Once approved, residents will receive a confirmation letter, approved order form and details on how to order a parkway tree.

Tree species and your cost for spring of 2014 are: Pear \$208.00; Swamp Oak, \$209.00; Read Oak \$230.00; and English Oak \$232.00

Pre-Order forms received by October 1st will be considered for planting in the spring.

Pace Bus Route 554 continues to improve. Since the bus enacted a regular schedule daily M-F and half day on Saturday, last year's ridership rose over 400 and steadily increases with ridership topping 533 in June. Pace has increased the subsidy per rider from \$4.00 to \$5.00 and the minimum recovery ratio from 18% to 17%. This Route is well within those benchmarks due to the ever increasing ridership count.

Long-time resident Madhu Raj presented one of his **works of Art** to the Village during his recent showing at the Hanover Park Park District. It was my honor to receive the Art on behalf of the people of Hanover Park and proudly display it in the Mayor and Manager's office. Thank you Madhu.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE



Domestic violence is a pattern of abusive behavior in any relationship that is used by one partner to gain or maintain power and control over another partner.

Domestic Violence Includes:

- Physical Abuse: hitting, pushing, biting, spitting, hair pulling, choking, preventing you from leaving.
- Sexual Abuse: unwanted touching or advances after being told “no”, forcing you to participate in unsafe or degrading sexual activity, forced sex (even by a partner with whom you also have consensual sex).
- Emotional Abuse: yelling, name calling, intimidating, criticizing, blaming, belittling, punching walls or breaking things, threatening to commit suicide if you leave, making you feel as if you can’t survive alone.
- Social Abuse: jealousy, controlling what you do, checking up on you, isolating you from friends and family, intimidating you, using the

- children as a means of controlling you, taking your phone away.
- Economic Abuse: making all the decisions about money, preventing you from working or sabotaging your job, denying you access to money, making you account for every penny you spend.
- Harassment: making unwanted phone calls, stalking, threatening.

There are many signs of an abusive relationship. The most telling sign is fear of your partner. If you feel like you have to constantly watch what you say and do in order to avoid an argument, chances are your relationship is unhealthy and abusive. Other signs that you may be in an abusive relationship include feelings of self-loathing, helplessness, and desperation. Abusers are very good at making you feel bad about yourself and blaming their abusive and violent behavior on you; eroding your self-esteem and making you feel powerless. No one should have to endure this type of treatment.

Noticing and acknowledging the signs of an abusive relationship are the first steps to ending it. If you recognize that you are in an abusive relationship, reach out. There are things you can do to protect yourself. Call the police and make a report as evidence of the abuse. The police will arrest the abuser when appropriate, inform you about Orders of Protection that can prohibit further abuse and potentially remove the abuser from your home, and provide resources for emergency shelter so you can remove yourself from the situation. It is also a good idea to talk to a professional about your options so that you can make informed decisions about your future.

Community Development

Community Development Staff and the Development Commission are working together to prepare for an **update to Village development regulations**. They are completing a draft of regulations that was prepared in 2011, following the completion of the Village's Comprehensive Plan, which will consolidate Zoning, Sign, and Subdivision regulations into one Unified Development Ordinance (UDO). The Development Commission, which reviews development applications and regulations, will take public comments and present their recommended regulations to the Village Board for review and approval.

The goal of this update is to establish guidelines for new development and maintenance of existing properties more up-to-date, clear, and connected with the goals of the Village. Updating of these regulations is a key step in implementing the Village's recently

completed Village Center Plan and Irving Park Corridor Study. The updated regulations will provide clear guidelines to businesses and residents of what is required for development submittal and how their development fits within the overall context of the Village. They will also encourage existing properties to continually improve in quality and appearance.

Particular sections that will be updated include site plan review, variances, landscaping, signage, accessory structures, and design guidelines. All residents and businesses are invited to participate in the discussion at the monthly Development Commission meetings or at the upcoming public hearing. Demolition of Old Menards

As a part of an overall economic development strategy, the Village has been working with the owner of the 'old Menard's' site at 900 Irving Park Road to encourage its redevelopment. In keeping with the recommendations of last summer's Irving Park Corridor Study, the property is being cleared and prepared for mixed-use residential and commercial development.

As a first step in this process, the former Menard's building will be demolished and site secured. The Village has received a filing of a demolition permit application, which will ensure safe demolition with minimized impacts. The Village has requested the contractor and owner's representative contact all neighbors in the immediate area to provide contact information for any concerns with the work.

Once prepared, plans for redevelopment of the site will go before the Development Commission and Village Board. Updates will be provided in upcoming HiLighters.

A bit of Hanover Park history: Remember when . . .

Hanover Barber Shop - Hanover Square Shopping Center Hanover Park's oldest business Celebrates its 50th Anniversary

Tony Perri, a barber from the South side of Chicago, came to Hanover Park in 1962 and saw phase one of the new Hanover Park 'N Shop Shopping Center on Barrington Road, (currently, Hanover Square Shopping Center.) This phase included a Gromer's Super Market and a Pic 'N Pay Walgreens Agency store.

By 1963, the Shopping Center had grown to include a Ben Franklin, Ace Hardware and a short mall section. It was then, in September of that year, when Tony opened the Hanover Barber Shop.

The male residents welcomed having a barber shop so near by, and soon Tony had to add more chairs and staff. Business was booming!

After 24 years in that mall location, and in conjunction with the remodeling and renaming of the mall to Hanover Park Shopping Center, Tony moved his Shop to its present mall location.

In 2001, after 38 years of serving the residents of Hanover Park and surrounding communities, Tony retired.

As Tony Perri retired, Tony Ruffolo took over management of the day to day operations and assumed full responsibility of running the shop following the passing of Mr. Perri in July of 2002.

Today, Tony Ruffolo and Frank have been there almost 40 years, with help from Andrea, who has been there 14 years.

Many of Hanover Park's children received their first haircut from Tony Perri, and have fond memories of him. Now, as adults, they are repeating the tradition and bringing in their children for their first haircuts and talking about their first time in the barber chair.

This year marks the 50th year for the oldest business still operating in the Village and retains the original name in honor of Tony Perri.

The Village of Hanover Park and residents thank Hanover Barber Shop for their devotion to the Village.
