## Lake Street Reconstruction Project Resumes; Lane Closures Now in Effect

Spring is here . . . and so is road construction season. In addition to the residential street resurfacing projects listed on page 4, work is continuing on the widening and reconstruction of Lake Street (U.S. Route 20) from East Bartlett Road to the Elgin/O'Hare Expressway. Work completed to date includes: storm sewer construction, adjustment of utilities, and the retaining wall construction. The new phase of construction which began in early March is requiring permanent lane closures. This construction will be divided into the following three stages:

### □ Stage 1 – March to Mid-June 2004

The first stage will reduce traffic to one lane in each direction. Traffic will be relocated onto the existing eastbound and temporary lanes of U.S. 20 while reconstruction takes place on the westbound side. Turn lanes will be provided at intersections where there are signals. However, at all side streets and driveways, there will be a common left turn lane for both directions of traffic.

### □ Stage II – Mid June to Mid September 2004

Stage two will immediately follow with traffic transferred to one lane in each direction on the westbound side of the roadway and the reconstruction on the eastbound lanes. Turn lanes and a common left lane will be included.

### □ Stage III – Mid-September to October 31, 2004

Stage three will immediately follow with traffic transferred to the outside lane in each direction. At this time the reconstruction of the medians will take place.

These lane closures will result in traffic congestion. Residents should adjust driving schedules and routes whenever possible to accommodate the anticipated traffic delays. 


## Come Early for the Best Bargains at Annual Police Auction on May 15

the annual Police Auction of unclaimed property.




Previewing begins at 8:00 AM; a professional auctioneer will put the first item up for bid at 9:00 AM.

## Minute with the Mayor . . .

Elected officials are in the process of reviewing the proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2005. We, like many of you, find ourselves needing to “tighten our belt” during our current economic conditions. The economic climate, along with unfunded mandates from the State of Illinois have put us in a real budget crunch.

In order to reduce expenses, your Hanover Park elected officials have to make some very difficult decisions. One of these decisions centers around the annual Harvest Fest held each Labor Day weekend. We have decided the Village will not conduct a Harvest Fest in 2004. This successful event has been put on hold as a cost saving effort. In addition to the cancellation of Harvest Fest, the Village will refrain from filling vacancies in positions within the Village.

The health, safety and well being of our residents are of paramount importance to this Village Board, and we must place these priorities ahead of any events. On behalf of the Village Board, I would like to thank you for your support and understanding.

The Hanover Park Police Department became an Accredited Law Enforcement Agency through (CALEA) in November 2001. This coming August, the department will undergo the process of reaccreditation. Three Law enforcement professionals from around the country will spend time at our Police Department to verify the Department’s continued compliance with some 446 standards that reflect the best professional requirements and practices for law enforcement agencies. The Hanover Park Police Department is one of only 54 out of 747 law enforcement agencies in the State of Illinois to be accredited.

The primary goals of accreditation are to strengthen crime prevention and control capabilities, formalize essential management procedures, establish fair and nondiscriminatory personnel practices, and improve service delivery. The benefits of accreditation include administrative improvements, reducing liability insurance costs, and public and professional recognition of international excellence.




# Village Honors Outstanding Residents, Businesses

Frank and Adelaide Grant-Acquah were recognized for their tireless work and outstanding dedication to Hanover Park's Sister Cities Committee.






## Youth of the Year

## Water Meter Replacement Program Continues

The Village is in the final year of a three year program to replace all residential water meters with radio-read units. This will allow the Village to read all meters in a matter of hours, as opposed to days, reducing costs. The area south of Lawrence Avenue will be completed this year. Beginning in May, the residents east of County Farm Road, north of Schick Road, and south of Lawrence Avenue will be receiving letters asking them to make an appointment. The actual change out of the meter takes less than 45 minutes. For more information contact the Public Works Department at 630-372-4440.

## 27 Village Streets Scheduled for Resurfacing

The Village of Hanover Park will be resurfacing 27 streets throughout the Village this spring.

The work will be initiated in May and will consist of grinding approximately 2 inches of existing asphalt off of the 27 streets and replacing with a new 2 inch thick asphalt surface course. Prior to the resurfacing drainage structures will be rebuilt, sections of deteriorated pavement will be patched, and deteriorated sections of curb and gutter will be replaced. It is anticipated that the resurfacing will be completed by the end of June.

## 0% Interest Loans Available to Income-Eligible Homeowners for Home Repairs

Qualified homeowners may be eligible for 0% interest home repairs loans. To qualify homeowners must meet the income requirements listed in the table to the right.

The North West Housing Partnership, which is administering the program, will determine the dollar amount of assistance the applicant is eligible to receive.

These loans are part of the Cook County Community Development Block Grant Program and the HOME Program, which are funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

## Spring Hydrant Flushing Begins May 3

It's that time of year again. Beginning Monday, May 3 and continuing through Friday, May 14, the Village Water Division will be flushing hydrants throughout the Village. The flushing will occur between the hours of 6:00 AM and 2:00 PM. Notices will be posted in designated areas prior to flushing.

Residents should not wash laundry during the flushing hours as rust staining of clothing may result. Residents with water softeners are encouraged to check the cycle time of their softeners so that the unit does not regenerate during this period.

Residents often ask why the Village flushes fire hydrants every year. The answer is that regular hydrant flushing is a vital part of routine maintenance for the water system for these important reasons:

- ❑ **Improves water quality:** Flushing removes minerals such as iron and magnesium that have collected in the water mains.
- ❑ **Improves water flow:** By removing these minerals, the inside diameter of a water main is increased and therefore allows a better flow of water.
- ❑ **Hydrant maintenance:** A fire hydrant is a mechanical device. Operation of a hydrant lubricates internal mechanisms and gaskets.
- ❑ **Hydrant inspection:** Any deficiencies are noted and repaired as necessary to insure that each hydrant will perform when needed for an emergency.

Hydrants will be flushed by area according to the following schedule:

South of Irving Park Road, north of Lake Street, west of Barrington Road

#### **May 6, 7**

South of Irving Park Road and east of Barrington Road, (Hanover Highlands and Longmeadows South Areas)

#### **May 10, 11, 12, 13**

Jensen Boulevard east to Farmstead Lane, north of Irving Park Road to Cynthia Lane and Hastings Lane

### DUPAGE COUNTY

#### **May 3, 4, 5, 6**

South of Devon Avenue, east of Church Road, west of Arlington Drive East (Greenbrook Area) Fremont and Glens area.

#### **May 7, 10**

South of Stearns Road, north of Schick Road

#### **May 11, 12, 13, 14**

South of Schick Road to Army Trail Road, east of Bayside Drive to west of Kuhn Road and west of Windjammer Lane.



## Ready to Get Rid of the Winter's Accumulation of Brush & Branches? Brush Pickup Resumes April 5

The Village of Hanover Park's annual Brush Pickup Program will take place in April. Listed below are the procedures residents need to follow in order to comply with requirements for the program.

### Set-Out Time – 7:00 AM

Brush can only be set out two days prior to 7:00 AM on your pick up day. Please do not put brush out after 7:00 AM on the first day of your collection cycle. Hold it for the next scheduled pickup. The Village incurs considerable cost returning to an area to collect brush set out after the first day of the collection cycle. It may take more than one day to pick up all the brush in a designated area. If brush is not picked up on the first day, it will still be picked up.

### Brush Pickup Schedule

#### April 5th – Area 1:

Streets north of Lake Street and west of Barrington Road.

#### April 12th – Area 2:

Streets north of Lake Street and east of Barrington Road

#### April 19th – Area 3:

Streets south of Lake Street and north of Lawrence Avenue

#### April 26th – Area 4:

Streets south of Lawrence Avenue

### What will be picked up:

- Branches a minimum of 2 feet in length and up to a maximum of 10 feet in length, and less than eight inches in diameter.

### What will NOT be picked up:

- Small hedge or pine clippings.
- Yard waste or brush in containers.
- Brush or branches with thorns.
- Tree stumps and roots.

### How to stack the brush:

- Brush should be stacked in one direction with the butt end toward the street.
- No lumber, wire, rope, or other materials may be included with the brush.
- Brush must NOT block the sidewalk.

### Yardwaste Collection Resumes April 2:

Yardwaste collection resumes regular yardwaste collection on Friday, April 2, 2004. Yardwaste stickers are available at Village Hall in addition to several retail outlets at a cost of \$1.65 per sticker. A yardwaste disposal sticker must be affixed to each Kraft paper yardwaste bag or through the handle of each plastic or metal container left at the curb. 

The Village will deliver loads of wood chips, a by-product of the Village's brush pickup program, to residents free of charge. Each load will average about four cubic yards – enough to fill an area six feet by six feet by three feet high (6' x 6' x 3'). The Public Works Department will deliver the wood chips and will dump them in the driveway only. Wood chips will not be dumped on driveway aprons, sidewalks, or lawns. Then plan to call J.U.L.I.E. (Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators) at 1-800-892-0123 at least two days (excluding Saturdays and Sundays) before you plan to dig.
