The Village has approved plans for the construction of a Veterans Memorial Plaza at the entrance of the Municipal Building. The plaza will consist of a flag pole for the American Flag, and five additional flag poles, each representing the five major armed services; Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines and Navy. In front of each flag will be a small column with the corresponding service logo. The center piece of the memorial will be a sculpture representing an eternal flame.

Residents will have an opportunity to donate to the construction of this memorial by purchasing a memorial brick honoring loved ones who have, or who are currently serving in the military, with the brick being placed in front of the service flag. The bricks will state their name, and service dates. Residents who have not served in the military will be able to purchase bricks in an area reserved for the public. Businesses and residents will also have the opportunity to donate towards larger items such as benches, flag poles or service medallions.

# Police Department

## Code Enforcement Curb Appeal Program

Hanover Park, like most other communities, has standards in the form of codes and ordinances which regulate how residential properties are to be maintained. These are necessary to protect the health, safety and well-being of our residents. Neighborhoods remain pleasant places to live and property values are protected when the regulations are followed. Property owners are required to meet Village property maintenance codes and ordinances in order to keep Hanover Park looking its best.

Each year Village Code Enforcement Officers inspect all residential properties. When violations are found, the resident is notified with a door hanger tag and a follow-up letter via U.S. Mail. Quite often, residents are already planning on making the needed repairs in the coming months. If the resident needs more time than allotted in the initial notification, it is strongly recommended that the Code Enforcement Officer, whose name and telephone number appears on the notice, be contacted for an extension. The key is maintaining communication with your Code Enforcement Officer and making a good faith effort to achieve compliance with the regulations. Following are some of the more common items requiring correction:

- Tall grass and weeds (over 8 inches in height)
- Garbage and recycling containers illegally stored in front of the home or at the side of the home in public view. Store the containers behind the home with tight-fitting lids or keep them inside your garage.
- Address numbers not displayed (numerals not less than 4 inches high)
- Driveways in serious disrepair
- Missing or torn window screens
- Rotting wood or peeling paint on the exterior



- Gutters and downspouts in good repair
- Inoperable vehicles (including vehicles not displaying current license plates) may not be stored except in a garage or, no more than one vehicle under a commercially manufactured cover in good condition.
- No bare areas or ruts in grass caused by pedestrians or vehicles
- Holiday decorations must be removed within 90 days of the Holiday.



## Village Board Approves Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2013

At their meeting of April 19, 2012, the Village Board approved the Fiscal Year 2013 Annual Budget establishing authorized expenditures and sources of revenues from May 1, 2012 through April 30, 2013.

In his Annual Budget message, the Village Manager stated "This budget document is in response to the needs of the citizens and business community of Hanover Park and is designed to provide a comprehensive overview of the Village's financial activities during the next twelve months."

Village President Rod Craig stated, "Staff has again exceeded expectations by asking for no new dollars as the Village Board pursues minimizing the impact upon our residents during this extended period of challenging economics. The elected officials of Hanover Park applaud everyone's efforts in pursuit of this goal."

This year's operating budget, excluding debt service, internal transfers, capital outlay and internal service funds, is approximately \$40,794,074, with General Fund expenditures totaling \$26,817,845.

## Spring into Safety



Summer is just around the corner. There is so much we can do once the weather is warmer, and most of those activities involve being outside.

We will start to see more residents out and about traveling by bicycle, skateboard, or the occasional rollerblader. Please remember, when you're by or on the roadways consider yourself invisible; never assume that you're seen by someone driving a vehicle.

Each year, more than 500,000 people in the United States are treated by emergency responders, and more than 700 people die as a result of bicycle related injuries. The most common serious injury is a result of trauma to the head. Some of the risks of brain injury can be lessened by simply wearing a helmet.

If you have children who like to ride their bike, skateboard or rollerblade, encourage them to wear their helmets. It could mean the difference between having a little fall with minor scrapes, to having a serious life-threatening injury. Also, remember to wear bright colored clothing.

If you're traveling during or after sunset, have something that reflects light so vehicles can notice you; you're not always seen by vehicles on the road. Always be on the defensive when approaching an intersection or driveway; never assume the driver sees you.

## Lawn Maintenance

With spring comes lawn maintenance. Before pulling out the lawn equipment, always refer to your owner's manual or go online to the manufacturer's website for recommended yearly maintenance. Maintenance will help your equipment run more efficient, have a long life, and be safe while in use.

Remember, while operating lawn equipment, always wear certified safety glasses or safety goggles and appropriate hearing protection. If you have questions as to what is appropriate for the equipment you're



operating, go to your local lawn and garden place and they'll be able to point you in the right direction. Just remember a few dollars spent for safety could mean a lifetime of enjoying the sights and sounds of the world around you.

## BBQ Grill Safety

Everybody loves an outdoor barbecue. However, outdoor cooking can also lead to tragedy when done carelessly. Below are some helpful safety tips:

- ◆ Make sure the barbecue grill is level, does not rock and is not in danger of tipping over.
- ◆ When lighting a grill, consider using an electric starter rather than a flammable liquid.
- ◆ Never add fire starter after you have started your barbecue. The heat from the coals could ignite the stream of liquid and burn back to the can, causing it to explode in your hands.
- ◆ Watch for flare-ups when cooking fatty meats or foods with high oil content.

- ◆ Keep combustible accessories such as mitts or paper plates at a safe distance.
- ◆ After cooking, soak the coals in water. Dispose of charcoal in a metal container such as a metal garbage can or pail. Do not bring the used coals into the house or garage.
- ◆ A bag of damp or wet charcoal should be immediately disposed of in a metal container with a lid, as it can spontaneously combust.
- ◆ Charcoal gives off deadly carbon monoxide fumes and should never be used indoors or brought into the house or garage.
- ◆ Never leave a hot grill unattended.
- ◆ Keep small children away from the barbecue.
- ◆ Never use your barbecue grill to burn waste or garbage.

## Public Works

### Overhead Sewer Program

Have you experienced sanitary sewer back-ups in your home from floor drains or fixtures? One way to prevent this from happening in the future is to install an overhead sewer system in your basement. If you are interested in installing such a system, the Village may be able to assist you.

The Village has a program that will cover up to 75 percent of the installation work, up to \$5,000. As the homeowner, you are responsible for the remainder.

### Sanitary Sewer Line Warranty Program



The Village of Hanover Park has partnered with Service Line Warranties of America, through the National League of Cities, to offer the residents of Hanover Park a sanitary sewer line warranty program. Homeowners are responsible for the maintenance and repair of the sewer service line from their home, all the way to the main, including the connection. If a repair is needed, it can cost thousands of dollars. This program will cover up to \$4,000 per incident, plus an additional \$4,000 if the public street needs to be cut for the repair. 


# Community Development



The **Village Center Plan and Transit-Oriented Development** is complete! Thanks to the hundreds of people who gave input through the survey, interviews, workshops, and open houses.

The plan outlines strategies for the development of a mixed-use Village Center around the Metra Station located near the intersection of Lake Street and Barrington Road/County Farm Road. The Village Center is envisioned to be a central gathering place for the community that uniquely represents Hanover Park. The plan includes land use and transportation plans, design guidelines, and implementation strategies, which will help the Village promote and shape development in the area.

The Village Center Plan focuses on development around the proposed Elgin-O’Hare Expressway extension and infill development within the Ontarioville area and along Lake Street. The plan calls for significant retail, higher-density housing, and business park development. The development will be transit-oriented, providing living, working, shopping, and entertainment opportunities within walking distance of various transportation options, including roads, busses, commuter rail, and walking and biking paths. Citizens will benefit with increased job opportunities, amenities, and housing in their own community.

## Outdoor Warning System

The Village of Hanover Park encourages residents and visitors to enjoy the spring and summer months after a long winter. Each year, during May and June, there is a chance severe weather events will occur. The Hanover Park Police Department would like to remind residents that when severe weather events occur the following procedure will take place:

The Outdoor Warning System will active warning residents that a severe weather event has been sighted and to seek appropriate shelter. Activated Sirens provide:



- Notification of a confirmed sighting of a tornado or funnel cloud by a police officer or firefighter within five miles of any point in Hanover Park;
- A confirmed sighting by a police officer or firefighter of severe winds causing structural damage within five miles of any point in Hanover Park;
- Receipt of a National Weather Service warning naming Hanover Park as being in the path of the storm;
- Receipt of a National Weather Service warning that names a neighboring community that borders Hanover Park as being in the path of the storm.

*Parents, take the time to educate your children in understanding the Outdoor Warning System's function and to seek appropriate shelter.*
