Suicide Prevention

Suicide occurs when a person ends their own life.

Suicide is the third leading cause of death among persons aged 15 – 24 years, and the eighth leading cause of death among all persons (CDC, 2010). What drives so many individuals to take their own lives? A suicidal person is in so much pain that he or she can see no other option. But despite their desire for the pain to stop, most suicidal people are deeply conflicted about ending their own lives. They wish there was an alternative but they just can't see one. A suicidal person may not ask for help, but that doesn't mean that help isn't wanted. Suicide prevention starts with recognizing the warning signs and learning how to respond if you detect them.

Suicide Warning Signs:

- Talking about suicide: Any talk about dying or self-harm, such as "I'd be better off dead."
- Changes in behavior: Mood swings, anxiety, agitation, personality changes, losing interest in normal activities, neglecting appearance, changes in eating or sleeping habits.
- Preoccupation with death: Unusual focus on death or violence. Writing songs or poems about death.
- No hope for the future: Feelings of hopelessness, helplessness, and the belief that things can't change.
- Self-hatred: Feelings of worthlessness, shame or guilt. Feeling like a burden to others.
- Saying goodbye: Getting affairs in order, giving away prized possessions, telling others they won't see you again, withdrawing from others, wanting to be left alone.
- Sudden sense of calm: Sudden calmness or happiness after being extremely depressed can mean that the person has decided to end their life.

If you spot the warning signs of suicide, it is important for you to take action to get the person help. However uncomfortable it may feel at first, start a conversation with the person. Tell them that you are concerned and ask if they are considering suicide. Let them know that they are not alone and that you will be there for them. If there is an immediate threat of suicide, stay with the person and call 911 for assistance. After the immediate suicidal crisis has passed, continue your support to ensure your loved one remains on the recovery track.

Suicide is preventable. There are services available in our community for the assessment and treatment of depression and suicidal behaviors. For more information, feel free to call me at (630) 823-5579 or call the suicide hotline at 1-800-273-8255.

Village Offers Non-Emergency Ambulance Transport Services

As an enhancement to the services already offered by the Hanover Park Fire Department, the Department's ambulances now provide both emergency and non-emergency ambulance transport services.

Since the 1940's the department has provided emergency ambulance service. In the mid 1970's the department became one of the first in the State to upgrade treatment capabilities from the Emergency Medical Technician Ambulance to Mobile Intensive Care Paramedics. The service again expanded in 2004 to begin providing paramedic level care from the Village's Engine Companies and has most recently moved into the non-emergency arena.

Patients who are in a convalescent state frequently require stretcher transports as part of their overall care plan. These transports include the movement of patients between care facilities or their home for the purpose of diagnostic testing, specialized medical treatment procedures and rehabilitation services. Although these transports require an ambulance and skilled emergency medical technicians or paramedics, the transport is typically scheduled and is non-emergency in nature. Medicare and medical insurance regulations recognize that non-emergency ambulance transports are an integral part of a comprehensive patient care plan and reimburse for ambulance transport services that are deemed medically necessary and ordered by the patients attending physician.

"The department's goal is to be the preferred non-emergency ambulance provider within the Village of Hanover Park by offering exceptional service and competitive pricing. The department offers both local and long distance transport service," states Fire Chief Craig Haigh.

Hanover Township looking for Emergency Services Volunteers

The Hanover Township Emergency Services Unit is looking for dedicated volunteers interested in public safety and community services. The Unit is trained to respond to a wide range of emergency and non-emergency events, and assist emergency responders in times of natural and man-made disasters. These professional volunteers provide a properly equipped, trained and ready unit to assist Hanover Township residents and the public safety agencies that serve them. The Unit is called out several times each month to direct traffic at accident scenes, provide lighting at emergency scenes, monitor severe weather and assist with crowd control at special events, and to assist with public safety patrols of unincorporated areas of Hanover Township. Fire Department

There is not a day that goes by when we don't need to make some sort of decision. The list of decisions we make in just twenty-four hours would be astonishing, if we were able to keep track of them all. On May 20th of this year, as an EF5 tornado was bearing down on Moore, Oklahoma, the residents had exactly 16 minutes to make a decision, a life or death decision.

Tornadoes can develop quickly, going from just a puffy white cloud in the sky to an on-the-ground twister within minutes. Do you and your family have a plan? Have you and your family already made decisions?

For the safety of its residents, the Village of Hanover Park maintains an Emergency Alert System designed to warn residents of impending severe weather:

- The warning system is tested the **first Tuesday of each month – shortly after 10:00 a.m.**
- The Alert Warning signal is a 3 – 5 minute steady signal from sirens.
- The Alert Warning Signal will change in volume as the siren rotates.
- When you hear the signal move to a place of safety.
- Turn on your radio or television and listen for essential emergency information.

In the event the Alert Warning signal is activated, residents should move to a place of safety immediately:

- Go to a pre-designated shelter area such as a safe room, basement, storm cellar, or the lowest building level.
- If there is no basement, go to the center of an interior room on the lowest level (closet, interior hallway) away from corners, windows, doors, and outside walls.
- Get as low to the floor as you can and use your arms to protect your head and neck.



In the event family members are not at home when severe weather strikes:

Have an alternate meeting location in case your home is uninhabitable. Power

lines, phone

lines, and cell

towers could be out of service due to the storm damage.

Have a secondary way of communicating with family members to let them know everyone is safe.

Designate a relative or family friend that lives out of state. Require everyone to call that person to let everyone know you are safe.

You can also let your family members know you are safe and well after an emergency by entering some information on the following web site. A family member can go on this site and search a person's name and if their information is entered they will be located in the search.

Garbage Collection Rate Increase



On July 1, 2013 the monthly rate for residential garbage collection and recycling will increase, per the five-year contract, to \$21.49 and yard waste stickers are increasing to \$2.44 per sticker.

NOTE: Normal trash collection is pushed back one day due to the July 4th holiday. Normal Friday pick up is on Saturday, July 6th.

Brush Pick Up Schedule



The Village will be picking up brush during the months of July and October in accordance with the following schedule:

- **Area 1 and 2 – July 8th and October 7th**
(Streets North of Lake Street)
- **Area 3 and 4 - July 22nd and October 21st**
(Streets South of Lake Street)

All branches must be out by 7:00 a.m. on the first day of pickup for your area.

Wood chips, which are a by-product of the Brush Pick Up program, are available for pick up or delivery. If interested, contact Public Works at 630.823.5700 for further information or to request a delivery.

DuPage River Sweep

The Environmental Committee participated in the May Conservation Foundation DuPage River Sweep. They cleaned the section of the west branch of the DuPage River from County Farm Road west 2,000 feet. Volunteers removed 10 tires, two bicycles, carpet and other items, along with 1.1 tons of garbage and 480 pounds of recyclable material.



Savings \$\$\$ and Reducing Light Pollution



That glow you see over the city at night isn't a fire, it's called light pollution, and it disrupts nature, affects our health, and wastes our money.

Tips to save money and reduce light pollution:

- Lighting to avoid trips, slips, and falls makes sense at 10:00 p.m. — it looks silly at 10:00 a.m., so check your timers.
- When you shop for outdoor bulbs, select only the minimum wattage needed.
- Always turn off lights you aren't using (especially exterior lights), and re-evaluate your lighting needs.
- When planning exterior lighting, purchase only well-designed, downward-facing light fixtures.
- Convert common "jelly-jar" porch and patio light fixtures by using specially-designed bulbs (www.bulbrite.com makes several kinds).
- Redirect your floodlights to where they are needed with simple clip-on shields (available at www.parshield.com).
- Visit www.darksky.org for more tips and suggestions, as well as a list of lights with the Fixture Seal of Approval.

New Location - 5th Annual Household Recycling Event

The Hanover Park Environmental Committee will be hosting their Household Recycling Event from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 28th at the Metra Station Lot located at the intersection of Lake Street and Church Street. Call 630-823-5706 or log on to www.hpil.org for details.



Acceptable items for recycling include:

- Bicycles, wheel chairs and crutches (must be in working, usable condition)
- Personal documents for shredding (limit three boxes per vehicle) no businesses, hard covers, binders, binder clips, or books
- Prescription and over-the-counter drugs (black out all prescription label information), medicated ointments, shampoos, liquids containing medication, prescription and over-the-counter inhalers, glass thermometers and other instruments containing mercury
- Motor oil and antifreeze
- Eye glasses, hearing aids, keys
- Scrap metal
- Large lead-acid batteries (auto, sump pump, SLA, marine batteries)
- Household batteries
- Cell phones and ink-jet cartridges
- CFL bulbs
- Clean, usable child and adult clothing
- Fire extinguishers
- Holiday lights and extension cords
- Household office equipment and electronic items (such as computers and monitors, TVs, VCRs, stereos, microwave ovens, cameras, video game equipment, and so on; see the Village web site for a complete list). All electronic items are recycled; none are resold or sent to organizations for re-use.

Finance Department

Village Electric Aggregation Program

On May 20th, the Village accepted a bid from Verde Energy USA, Illinois LLC. to provide electricity supply for the Village's electric aggregation program. The alternative energy supplier will charge 5.556 cents per kilowatt hour, saving customers about 8 percent (8%) compared to ComEd's rate. Officials expect the new rate, guaranteed for one year, to take effect in late August. Residents and small businesses will be enrolled automatically unless they opt out of the program.

Community Development

In May, the Mayor, Village Manager, and Village Planner attended the International Council of Shopping Centers (ICSC) RECon convention in Las Vegas to promote economic development in Hanover Park. RECon is the global convention for the retail real estate industry. This year's conference was the largest since the beginning of the recession, with over 30,000 attendees and 1,000 exhibitors.

For the third year, the Village exhibited at the Choose DuPage Economic Development Alliance booth. Participating in the booth allowed the Village to have a professional and attractive space to hold meetings for a low cost and time investment. The group also provided an opportunity to share ideas with neighboring municipalities including Downers Grove, Bensenville, Naperville, and Villa Park. Special thanks to Choose DuPage President and CEO Greg Bedalov for his help and efforts in coordinating a successful event.

At the conference, the Village focused on promoting development and redevelopment of key available properties in the Village. These included the Hanover Square Shopping Center, area around the old Menards at Irving Park and Wise Roads, Village Center area around the Metra Station at Lake Street and Barrington Road, Irving Park Road Corridor, and intersection of Lake Street and Gary Avenue. The group met with a number of developers, brokers, and property owners to discuss specific potential for these properties and build an understanding of the Village's overarching goals. They also toured the retail exhibitor hall to meet local representatives, learn about their site requirements, and promote spaces in Hanover Park.

Overall, the conference is a great opportunity to meet with a large amount of people in a short amount of time, sharing opportunities and learning about best practices and trends. A theme throughout the meetings was that people are in a more confident position than in previous years to make business investments and begin projects.


