I recently participated in a **radio interview** with Dawna Watson, where we had an opportunity to talk about Hanover Park and the good news in the home sales market. It is on the Village’s government access Channel 13 for your listening pleasure.

State Capital Update: I’ve been representing Hanover Park’s interests with our legislators in Springfield on numerous occasions this year. The Governor has again opened the door to use our local share of the State Income Tax revenue. In 1970, the legislator working in harmony with local officials earmarked 10% for local distribution. This was a marvelous initiative, as it removed the opportunity for local governments to implement a local income tax. Your municipal leaders across the State do not support Legislators solving their debt problems

upon our backs. My hope for this legislative session is that the State solves their debt problem and does not push their debt on the local taxing bodies.

The Village Board has again passed a **balanced budget** for the coming fiscal year, and our Finance Department has received the prestigious Government Financial Officers Association (GFOA) Award for Excellence. Well done to Staff and the Village Board.

Recently, I served as **Principal for the Day** at Ontarioville School. I had a wonderful visit and tour, and the Student Council was very energized. One young man completed a history of Ontarioville School and was very proud of his work. Well done to our Ontarioville students, teachers, and Principal Myrna Burgos.

On May 4th, **“Coffee with the Board”** event will be held in the Community Room at the Police Department. I will present my State-of-the-Village address. We are looking forward to new revenue with the opening of Tony’s Finer Foods (they are hiring up to 250 employees). We are also encouraged with the interest of new businesses, like Discount Tire, asking about opportunities to develop and grow. You may have noticed all the improvements along Barrington Road...it is good and there is more to come.

Recently, Hanover Park held its **“Kids at Hope”** Resource Day in the Park District Building. Thank you to all the participants. Additionally, along with superb support from the Hanover Park Park Foundation, our **“Youth Benefit Ball”** was a huge success. Many thanks to Dr. Jose Torres, Superintendent of School District U-46, for his outstanding message about our children and their needs today. Kids do have opportunities in Hanover Park!



Finance Department - FY14 Budget

On March 21, 2013, the Village Board approved the Fiscal Year 2014 Annual Budget, which establishes authorized expenditures and sources of revenues from May 1, 2013 through April 30, 2014.

Village Manager Juliana Maller stated, "This budget document is in response to the needs of the citizens and business community of Hanover Park and is designed to provide a comprehensive overview of the Village's financial activities during the next twelve months."

Village President Rodney Craig stated, "We have completed our budgeting process for the coming year and are pleased to announce the budget is balanced. Revenues are slow to rebound and costs continue to rise. Another lean year is in the plan, as we continue to pursue good stewardship of resident tax dollars."

This year's operating budget, excluding debt service, internal transfers, capital outlay and internal service funds is approximately \$44,209,264. General Fund operating expenditures total \$28,563,147.

Spring into Safety

Summer is just around the corner. There is so much we can do once the weather is warmer, and most of those activities involve being outside.



You will start to see more residents out and about traveling by bicycle, skateboard, or the occasional rollerblader. Please remember, when you are by or on the roadways consider yourself invisible; never assume that you are seen by someone driving a vehicle.

If you have children who like to ride their bike, skateboard or rollerblade, encourage them to wear their helmets. It could mean the difference between having a little fall with minor scrapes, to having a serious life-threatening injury. Also, remember to wear brightly colored clothing.

If you're traveling during or after sunset, have something that reflects light so vehicles can notice you; you are not always seen by vehicles on the road. Always be on the defensive when approaching an intersection or driveway; never assume the driver sees you.

Lawn Maintenance

With spring comes lawn maintenance. Before pulling out the lawn equipment, always refer to your owner's manual or go online to the manufacturer's website for recommended yearly maintenance. Maintenance will help your equipment run more efficient, have a long life, and be safe while in use.



Remember, while operating lawn equipment, always wear certified safety glasses or safety goggles and appropriate hearing protection. If you have questions as to what is appropriate for equipment, visit your local lawn and garden center.

BBQ Grill Safety

Here are some helpful tips for grilling outdoors:

- ◆ Make sure the grill is level, does not rock and is not in danger of tipping over.
- ◆ When lighting a grill, consider using an electric starter rather than a flammable liquid.
- ◆ Never add fire starter after you have started your grill. The heat from the coals could ignite the stream of liquid and burn back to the can, causing it to explode in your hands.
- ◆ Watch for flare-ups when cooking fatty meats or foods with high oil content.
- ◆ Keep combustible accessories such as mitts or paper plates at a safe distance.
- ◆ After cooking, soak the coals in water and dispose of charcoal in a metal container such as a metal garbage can or pail. Do not bring the used coals into the house or garage.
- ◆ A bag of damp or wet charcoal should be immediately disposed of in a metal container with a lid, as it can spontaneously combust.
- ◆ Charcoal gives off deadly carbon monoxide fumes and should never be used indoors or brought into the house or garage.
- ◆ Never leave a hot grill unattended.
- ◆ Keep small children away from the grill.
- ◆ Never use your grill to burn waste or garbage.

Code Enforcement Curb Appeal Program

Each year Village Code Enforcement Officers (CEO's) inspect all residential properties. When violations are found, the resident is notified with a door hanger tag and a follow-up letter via U.S. mail. Often, residents are already planning on making the needed repairs in the coming months. If a resident needs more time than allotted in the initial notification, we

recommend they contact the CEO listed on the notice for an extension. The key is maintaining communication with your CEO and making a good faith effort to achieve compliance with the regulations.

The following are some of the more common items requiring correction:

- Tall grass and weeds (over 8 inches in height);
- Garbage and recycling containers illegally stored in

front of the home or at the side of the home in public view. Store the containers behind the home with tight-fitting lids or keep them inside your garage;

- Address numbers not displayed (numerals not less than 4 inches high);
- Driveways in serious disrepair;
- Missing or torn window screens;
- Rotting wood or peeling paint on the exterior;
- Gutters and downspouts in good repair;
- Inoperable vehicles (including vehicles not displaying current license plates) may not be stored except in a garage or, no more than one vehicle under a commercially manufactured cover in good condition;
- No bare areas or ruts in grass caused by pedestrians or vehicles;
- Holiday decorations must be removed within 90 days of the Holiday.

Village garage sale sign regulations reminder:

No permits are required for garage sales. However, signs that violate the sign regulation will be removed and disposed of by Village personnel. Property owners may receive citations based upon repeat offenses.

- Signs may only be displayed on private property;
- Signs may not be attached to trees, utility poles, parked vehicles, fences or roofs;
- Signs are not permitted in Village parkways (area between the sidewalk and street);
- Only one sign is permitted on the property where the sale is located. Corner lot properties may display two signs on the private property, one facing each street;
- Signs may not exceed 6 square feet per side (2 feet by 3 feet) and 4 feet in height;
- Off-site signs are permitted only on private property with the consent of the owner;
- Signs must be removed at the conclusion of the sale;
- Garage sale signs must identify the date and the address of the sale;
- Signs may only be displayed one day prior to and on the day of the sale.



Outdoor Warning System



Each year, during May and June, there is a chance severe weather events will occur. The Hanover Park Police Department would like to remind residents that when severe weather events occur the following procedure will take place:

Activation of the Outdoor Warning System alerts residents that severe weather has been sighted and to seek appropriate shelter. Activated Sirens provide:

- Notification of a confirmed sighting of a tornado or funnel cloud by a police officer or firefighter within five miles of any point in Hanover Park;
- A confirmed sighting by a police officer or firefighter of severe winds causing structural damage within five miles of any point in Hanover Park;
- Receipt of a National Weather Service warning naming Hanover Park as being in the path of the storm;
- Receipt of a National Weather Service warning that names a neighboring community that borders Hanover Park as being in the path of the storm.

Parents, take the time to educate your children in understanding the Outdoor Warning System's function and to seek appropriate shelter.

- A zest for living and the ability to laugh and have fun;
- The ability to deal with stress and bounce back from adversity;
- A sense of contentment, meaning and purpose;
- The flexibility to learn new things and adapt to change;
- The ability to build and maintain fulfilling relationships.

Reminder to PET OWNERS

Village Ordinance, requires all cats and dogs be vaccinated against rabies by the age of four months and to display a Village license tag on a collar to be worn at all times. Tags can be purchased at the Municipal Center for \$5.00 each calendar year. Senior Citizens are free.



Dogs must be controlled at all times and may only be walked on a leash not exceeding eight feet in length. It is unlawful to walk your pet without possessing a device to immediately remove any excrement deposited by the animal on public or private property.

Be respectful of the neighbors around you and monitor your dog or cat when outside. Do not allow them to howl, yelp, whine, meow, bark or make noise in such a manner as to disturb other citizens.

In order to maintain your mental health, it's important to take care of yourself so you'll be better prepared to deal with challenges if and when they arise.

Tips and strategies for taking care of yourself:

- Take care of your body: get enough rest, exercise (to relieve stress and elevate your mood), eat well, limit alcohol and avoid cigarettes and other drugs;
- Learn or discover new things: read a book, join a club, take an adult education class;
- Connect with others: limit TV or computer use, spend face-to-face time with loved ones, volunteer and help others, consider getting a pet;
- Stay positive: try to limit unhealthy mental habits like worrying or thinking negative thoughts;
- Make leisure time a priority: talk to a friend, go for a walk, listen to music, do things that challenge your creativity;
- Take care of your spirit: think about the things you're grateful for, pay attention to what is good in your life, enjoy the beauty of nature or art, meditate;
- Manage your stress levels: achieve a balance between work and play, reach out to others for support, practice relaxation techniques.

If you have made consistent efforts to improve your mental health and you still do not feel good, consider seeking professional help. Overall quality of life is greatly improved when a person with a mental health problem receives appropriate treatment.
