**B**eginning in the summer of 2010, the Village began the process of developing a new Comprehensive Strategic Plan.

Planning helps an organization frame what it is, what it does, and how it will accomplish its mission in the future. It helps identify the vision and provides guidance and direction in choosing the right path for future success. It deals with decisions made today that will affect the future.

Fire Chief Craig A. Haigh, who managed the planning process for the Village, says "Planning is essential to continue efficiency and effectiveness. The strategic planning process helped us set priorities and develop a plan to better meet the needs of our residents and businesses."

The process undertaken was multifaceted in nature and involved Elected Officials, staff, and personnel within each of the various Village departments. The goal was to develop a plan that is used daily to guide overall decision making. The plan focuses on the next three years and will be reviewed and updated beginning in 2013.

## Minute with the Mayor ...

I have been working with our legislators in Springfield, and they have agreed to continue to support our **Local Government Distribution Fund**. During numerous visits and meetings with our responsible leaders, the Legislative session came to a close, and our share of the revenues remained untouched. I am grateful, as a loss of these dollars would have had serious impact on the delivery of Village services.

At our **May “Coffee with the Board”** it was my pleasure to share with residents our successful budget year and our balanced budget for this fiscal year. I spoke of successes in Policing, Fire, Public Works and the impending changes

in our Commercial Code Enforcement/Inspection process. The State of the Village presentation can be viewed on the Village web site at [www.hpil.org](http://www.hpil.org)

You may have heard the promotion of **Hanover Park on WBBM NewsRadio**. As the economy evolves, we remain optimistic that we can work effectively with the individuals we are meeting through this ad campaign.

I received positive feedback during our visit with developers at the **International Council for Shopping Centers Convention**. Hanover Park has a plan for developers to improve our economics with a goal to keep our homeowner taxes low and add to the number of jobs available in town.

With the signing of **Senate Bill 3778** by Governor Quinn, the **Seniors Ride Free program** now establishes income limits for eligibility. People who are currently registered for the Seniors Ride Free program should review the changes. The RTA has up to 180 days to implement these changes, stating that seniors must be enrolled in the State's Circuit Breaker program to remain eligible for free rides. All seniors age 65 and older who are not eligible for the revised program will pay the reduced fare of \$0.85 on Pace fixed route service. Please note there are no changes to the People With Disabilities Ride Free Program.

Finally, it continues to be my pleasure to represent the people of Hanover Park, our hometown. We cannot do it without you! **Take the time to volunteer and give back to our town**, at the schools, churches, or assisting on the playing field. We are a Village that believes all youth will achieve and have hope for success without exception. Together we are finding ways to believe in our youth, and together we can make a difference in Hanover Park.


## Board Approves Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2012 Without a Property Tax Increase

On April 21, 2011, the Village Board approved the Fiscal Year 2012 Annual Budget that establishes authorized expenditures and sources of revenues from May 1, 2011 through April 30, 2012.


In his Annual Budget message, Village Manager Ron Moser stated this budget document is in response to the needs of the residents and businesses of Hanover Park and is also designed to provide a comprehensive overview of the Village's financial activities during the next Fiscal year.

"The Completion of the fiscal year 2012 budget was a collaboration of the Finance Committee and staff. They have exceeded our expectations by asking for no new dollars as the Village Board pursues minimizing the impact on our residents during a period of challenging economics. We applaud everyone's efforts in pursuit of this goal." said Village President Rodney Craig.

This year's operating budget, excluding debt service, capital outlay and internal service funds, is approximately \$41,044,743. General Fund expenditures total \$25,298,205.

The DuPage County Emergency Telephone System Board (ETSB) now offers a new service called **Smart911**. By participating in this new service, first responders, Police, Fire and EMTs will have important information to help them address your emergency.

**Smart911** is supported by existing 9-1-1 fees and is free to register. Your family's profile information is completely private and secure. The details you enter on our secure and protected website are only shared with 9-1-1 dispatchers and first responders in the field, and only when you or a family member dial 9-1-1.

heart conditions, allergies, and stroke history. When 9-1-1 receives a call, EMS will arrive with the appropriate equipment.



### HELP Police Protect You



- For those who have a family member with Alzheimer's, Autism or who is deaf, this service helps as well. Instantly, 9-1-1 knows the caller's condition and location without having to rely on verbal communication.

### HELP the Fire Dept. Rescue You



- When a child goes missing it takes time for Police to obtain a photo of the missing child. With **Smart911**, Police have that photo instantly and are better prepared to begin a wide scale search.
- If your 9-1-1 call is dropped for any reason, this service helps Police locate and assist you and your family during emergencies.

### HELP EMS Treat You

- By participating in this service you can relay your family's medical issues such as:

- With **Smart911**, call takers can notify firefighters of exactly how many people live in your home, including pets, to ensure that everyone is rescued during a fire. Additionally, if you live in an apartment building, firefighters will not only know the address, but the floor and apartment number as well.

### Brush Pick Up Schedule

### Garbage Rate Increases July 1<sup>st</sup>

In accordance with our five year Franchise Agreement with Allied Waste please note the following:

- Garbage collection for single family homes, duplexes, and triplexes will increase 4.5% up to \$19.68 per month
- Yard waste stickers will increase to \$2.24 per sticker
- Special pickups will increase to \$21.00 per cubic yard
- Appliance pick remains at \$25.00.

### Touch a Truck

On April 30<sup>th</sup>, volunteers and members of our Environmental Committee took part in the




stenciling of storm sewer inlets in the Village. 100 storm sewer inlets were stenciled in yellow paint with the words "Dump No Waste, Drains To River".

- Personal documents for shredding (3 box limit per vehicle. No businesses. No hard covers, binders, binder clips, or books. Staples and paper clips OK)
- Motor oil and anti-freeze
- Eye glasses, hearing aids and keys
- Scrap metal
- Large lead-acid batteries (automobile, sump pump, SLA, marine batteries only)
- Household batteries
- Cell phones and ink-jet cartridges
- CFL bulbs
- Clean, usable child and adult clothing
- Fire extinguishers
- Household office equipment and household electronic items (computers and monitors, TVs, VCRs, stereos, microwave ovens, cameras, video game equipment, etc.) All electronic items are recycled; none are resold or sent to organizations for re-use.

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

### Director's Update

Representatives of the Village of Hanover Park and I attended the recent International Council of Shopping Centers convention in Las Vegas. This convention represents the best opportunity to meet with retailers and developers from across the United States.

While there, we made it our mission to espouse the benefits of locating in Hanover Park. We took with us a variety of handouts that highlighted our Tax Increment Financing (TIF) districts and other available properties.

It was clear that everyone is decidedly more upbeat about the economy than they have been in recent years. Several people have already heard our radio ads and others were intrigued by the incentives we offer and the public-private partnerships we have proposed that will make the Village an integral part of future developments. We believe we've identified a number of available opportunities that will improve and upgrade the image of the Village.

These opportunities are currently being refined and will be rolled out over the next few months. We also received great feedback over the proactive marketing stance that the Village has embarked upon. We believe this will lead to more active development for Hanover Park.

### Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) Technical Assistance Grant

Hanover Park was chosen among 130 municipalities to receive technical assistance from CMAP. CMAP will work with the Village on workforce training, Irving Park Road corridor development, and foreclosure response programs.

Assistance will initially focus on a pilot workforce training center that will offer satellite community college classes, as well as employment assistance. This innovative new center is being developed cooperatively by Hanover Park, WorkNet Illinois, Elgin Community College, Harper College, and College of DuPage.

CMAP will provide policy support and research the needs of local employers to help develop useful programs.

CMAP is the regional planning organization for northeastern Illinois. In 2010, they released the GO TO 2040 comprehensive regional plan, calling for livable communities with strong economic activity, efficient governance and regional mobility. With the help of a \$4.25 million federal grant from the Sustainable Communities Initiative, the Local Technical Assistance Program will help area communities implement the goals of the regional plan.

Hanover Park was chosen because our planning initiatives work to strengthen not just our community, but the region as a whole.

## Firework Safety and Enforcement

Fireworks during the 4th of July are as American as apple-pie, but did you know that more fires are reported on that day than any other day of the year in the United States? More than half of these fires are caused by fireworks. The good news is you can enjoy your holiday and the fireworks, with just a few simple safety tips:

- Leave fireworks to the professionals. Do not use consumer fireworks. It is unlawful for any person to possess, offer for sale, expose for sale or sell any fireworks as defined by the Fire prevention code. Fireworks are illegal under the Village of Hanover Park Municipal Code as well as state statute.
- The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend a public display conducted by trained professionals.
- After the firework display, children should never pick up fireworks that may be left over, they may still be active.

### Tips of Sparklers:

- Sparklers burn at **1200 °F** (glass melts at **900 °F**) and can cause a person 3rd degree burns instantly.
- Have water available to pour on any sparklers that have been dropped on the ground. **Do not** attempt to pick up a sparkler once it is dropped.
- Have a bucket of water for the sparkler stick to be disposed of after they go out. Sparklers remain hot for several minutes after they go out.
