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### 7-a. Signage Update

Village Planner Ainsworth and Director Govind presented findings from the Special Sign Meeting held with the Development Commission, CONECT Committee and Hanover Park businesses. Please see attached memorandum.

The Committee discussed and recommended the following:

- In regards to Temporary signs did not have any issues with limits. Feel if a sign is going to be up for an extended period of time it should be permanent.
- Businesses on a corner lot can they have signage on both façade's?
- Businesses set back from the road what can be done to help increase visibility?
- Staff will work on options to be presented at a later date; the options will have to work for all not just for one.
- Would like the use of "Sandwich Board Signs" permitted. Village can regulate zoning but not content of signage.
- More directional signage.
- "L" shaped signs. Allow but with criteria.

**7-b. Maxwell Street** - follow-up regarding adding food vendors to this event. The Village Clerk met with the Villages Health Inspector to outline details that would allow food vendors to sell prepackaged shelf stable products at the event.

- They would need to submit an application a week before the event for review.

- In addition to adding food vendors the event is being re-marketed/re-branded: Market@theMetra. Market presents a more positive appeal.

- A survey will be sent to all vendors to ask what they would like to see at this event.

#### **Agenda Item:**

#### **Sign Regulations**

The purpose of this meeting is to collect feedback to help the Village in the process of updating our sign regulations.

The meeting was opened up at 5:10 p.m. by Director of Community & Economic Development Shubhra Govind, who presented the purpose and background details leading up to the recent Supreme Court ruling pertaining to sign regulations (main point being Content Neutrality) and the need to update the current sign regulations for the Village of Hanover Park. A PowerPoint presentation was shown depicting various types of signs and also what signs are prohibited in the current sign code.

#### **QUESTIONS/ANSWERS:**

**QUESTION:** When does the Supreme Court ruling go into effect?

**ANSWER:** The Supreme Court ruling went into effect in June, 2015.

**QUESTION:** When do we have to become compliant?

**ANSWER:** The ruling allows time for Villages to review and revise their codes.

**QUESTION:** Can we be permitted to place "Garage Sale" signs in parkways?

**ANSWER:** Multiple lawn signs are not permitted but the code allows for Political signs.

**QUESTION:** Spotlights are they allowed?

**ANSWER:** No they are not permitted.

**QUESTION:** Has anyone reviewed the changes from the Supreme Court with the Villages?

**ANSWER:** Not as of yet it will take some time.



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**STATEMENT:** The purpose of this meeting is to collect feedback on the Villages current regulations to determine what is working and not working.

**QUESTION:** Monument signs are very expensive and require landscaping, are there grants to help businesses that have to replace a pole sign and install a monument sign to meet current sign code?

**ANSWER:** Changes must be made to bring sign into compliance.

**QUESTION:** Can the height of the monument sign be increased? There are mature trees on the parkway in front of our business sign that block the view from the street, if this sign can be taller it will resolve this issue. Their current pole sign is not attractive but to change would be cost prohibited, need help deciding what they can do.

**ANSWER:** Maximum height for a monument sign is 8' made of masonry.

**QUESTION:** Can an exception to the rule be made for businesses with a challenge?

**ANSWER:** If we allow one then we will have to allow others. If not permitted the option to apply for a variance is not available.

**QUESTION:** If it is just a height issue can we increase the height to 10 – 12'?

**ANSWER:** It may present a visibility issue. Shopping centers can have higher signs, but some have their own rules in a PUD.

**QUESTION:** The Olde Salem Plaza has a small business owners association that sent a letter to the Board/Mayor regarding their sign issues. Problem is the shopping center is very secluded and the sign is not visible due to landscaping directly in front of the sign. Can they put signage on the east side of building and back side? Also can they stencil the business names on the back of the doors of each business which is visible to vehicles driving on Wise Road? They are losing business due to visibility issues. When Menards was there they had more pedestrian traffic coming to the area, now that they are gone and the lot is empty it hurts their businesses.

**ANSWER:** The Village will have our Public Works department go out and look at the landscaping and see if they can make any changes to help make the current sign more visible.

**QUESTION:** County Farm Liquors is located at County Farm Road and Stearns Road. Most of the traffic comes from Stearns which is the side of their building. They would like to put a sign on the side of their building.

**QUESTION:** Can they have a larger more visible sign with an increased size of the business name?

**QUESTION:** Hanover Square Shopping Center can they have a sign on the south side of the building? They also would like to have business names stenciled on the back doors of each business.

**QUESTION:** Can businesses have more times to use Temporary Signs and for longer periods of time? Such as six times a year for two weeks each and they will have different signs that represent seasonal sales campaigns.

**QUESTION:** What do other communities do? We do not allow any feather signs – why not they are very trendy and up to date? Can we keep up to date with modern traits?



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**QUESTION:** We see other feather signs being displayed along the borders of Hanover Park so why can't we be more consistent with surrounding communities. We understand that having these signs near an intersection may pose a safety issue.

**QUESTION:** Having certain signs for Grand Openings help brand the event and make residents aware something special is going on can we establish a standardization of these types of signs?

**ANSWER:** If we do then we are regulating content which is not permissible. If the Chamber would like to establish a suggested sign for grand openings then that is within their purview.

**QUESTION:** Can Feather Signs be permitted on a temporary basis for a limited time and only so many times per year?

**QUESTION:** What is the time frame for the revisions of the sign regulations?

**ANSWER:** This is the very first workshop and the Village Staff and Village Attorney will need time to attend workshops and familiarize themselves with the new regulations so we cannot determine a deadline at this time.

**QUESTION:** Why does the Village prohibit Vehicle Signs? If the vehicle is professionally decorated and parked in front of own business what is the problem?

**QUESTION:** The sign code is so antique why does the Village not listen to businesses? Closed businesses are not good for anyone.

**QUESTION:** Why can't there be the same regulation for a banner vs. a permanent sign.

**QUESTION:** What would be a reasonable time frame for banner signs? 3-4 weeks, 6-4 times a year, last the whole duration of a sale, last a month.

**ANSWER:** Most businesses in attendance felt 4 times a year is reasonable.

**QUESTION:** Jiffy Lube has 107 stores in Chicagoland and they run sales at a minimum quarterly at a National Level and do not have the same restrictions in other areas.

**QUESTION:** What about businesses that are set back from the road, can variances be offered?

**QUESTION:** We allow Food Trucks with signage to park at an event why can't business have their business vehicles parked in front of their businesses or at least allow for special events.

**Statement:** Compliance is everything but the businesses need to have regulations that are easy to comply with and make sense.

**QUESTION:** Why are walking signs not allowed?

**ANSWER:** Keep in mind safety issues.

**RE:** Summary of Proposed Changes to the Sign Ordinance

**Background**

Community and Economic Development Staff have been working on updating the Village's Sign Ordinance (Municipal Code Chapter 6). Staff worked on the update with a comprehensive range of activities in order to provide a fair and balanced Sign Ordinance which included: assessing the Ordinances of all neighboring communities, hosting a Sign Ordinance Workshop, meeting with numerous stakeholders and using the latest information available to ensure that the Ordinance meets all laws. The outline below is a summary of the main parts of the staff recommendations on the Sign Ordinance update.

**Questions for the C.O.N.E.C.T. Committee to Consider**


Staff has been working through section by section on the Sign Ordinance Update and there have been a few questions raised about specific aspects of the Ordinance and what direction should the proposed amendments take. With this notion, staff is requesting feedback from the C.O.N.E.C.T. Committee with the following questions:

1. Directional Signs – Currently, the Sign Ordinance allows one six square foot directional sign for a business at each curb cut. However, restaurants that have drive-through windows often have two directional signs per curb cut to notify drivers to either enter or exit the site. Staff is requesting feedback from the Committee if the number of signs per curb cut and the size of the directional signs is appropriate.



1 - This drive-through quick service restaurant shows three directional signs located near a right-in, right-out curb cut to direct drivers when accessing their property.

2. Allowable Variances – Currently, there is a variance that a business owner can apply for to allow for a three sided monument sign. All free-standing signs are allowed to be double sided (and cannot be v-shaped). The intent with this variation is to allow a business to advertise their services when they are located on a piece of property where a two-sided sign is not feasible. The photo below shows a corner gas station (southeast corner of Gary and Army Trail Road that is an “L-shaped” four-sided sign and staff is requesting feedback for the Committee to consider increasing the variance’s “three-sided sign” to a “four-sided sign”.
3. Off-Premise Signage- The Sign Ordinance currently allows for a business to apply for variance to have off-premise signage where their freestanding sign can located 500 feet off their property. Staff is wondering if the Committee supports this type of variance as staff is concerned with now potentially allowing two free-standing signs on a commercially zoned property. Per the Sign Ordinance, two freestanding signs are not allowed on one zoning lot. Moreover, staff is wondering if the off-premise sign shall be combined with the other property’s signage. An alternative thought to consider is changing the language in the variance section from off-premise freestanding sign to a directional sign. A directional sign would be smaller than a free-standing sign and the intention of a directional sign is to direct a customer to the subject business instead of simply advertising the business.
