## Welcome to 2014 and Winter



### Snow Shoveling Tips It doesn't have to be painful

- \* Wear layers you can move in and don't forget your hat and gloves.
- \* An ergonomically designed shovel with a bent handle is usually the best choice. A sturdy plastic shovel is lighter than a metal shovel. Keep a shovel on hand in case your blower malfunctions or for small areas you want to clear quickly.
- \* Purchase salt mixtures meant for deicing and spread on the ice. Shovel away thicker ice after the salt has broken it down. Be careful when using salt on unsealed concrete as it can cause damage. (If salt is not an option for you use sand or kitty litter to provide traction and help prevent slips and falls.)
- \* Lift with your legs, not your back, and take frequent breaks as needed. Don't attempt to throw snow over your shoulder.
- \* Shovel snow as soon as possible. Fresh snow is less compact and easier to move.
- \* Have a shovel on hand for every member of your family. Ask neighbors to keep common areas clear and work will be done in no time.

### WINTER PARKING Regulations

**NO PARKING** on Village streets after **TWO inch snowfall** 62-11-1323. *Limited parking for snow removal.*



*It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any public street in the Village at any time within 24 hours after a snowfall of two inches or more has occurred, except on those streets where late night parking is permitted in Section 62-11-1327(b), that within 24 hours after a snowfall of two or more inches vehicles shall be parked only on the side of the street on the day during which late night parking is permitted.*

**What is ART?** The Hanover Park Police Department employs the Area Response Team (ART) strategy in an effort to work with citizens to protect life, reduce crime and improve quality of life in the Village. Under the ART strategy, police officers from four patrol shifts are permanently assigned to the same geographic area or "beat" for a period of one year, providing opportunities for officers to increase their familiarity with the residents within their beat, as well as the problems and challenges that they face.

In addition to being able to reach out to ART Officers at any time, residents in each area are invited to meet with the police and other residents in their ART Area to discuss issues of mutual interest and concern during four pre-scheduled ART meetings throughout the year. Typically, the topics include crime trends and patterns, legislative updates, crime reduction tips, as well as concerns and feedback of the residents in the area.




### New State Cell Phone Ban Becomes Law January 1<sup>st</sup>

Effective January 1, 2014, drivers will need to go to a hands-free device for cell phones or risk being ticketed. The new hands-free driving law follows the already banned texting while driving and no cell phone use in a school or construction zone laws already in place.

## New Balcony Storage Ordinance



On October 24, 2013 the Village Board adopted an ordinance modifying Section 18-92 of Article IV Property Maintenance Code within Chapter 18 of the Municipal Code of Hanover Park. The amended ordinance now prohibits certain personal property located on balconies. It is now unlawful to permit or use any exterior balcony for the placement or storage of any items **except** furniture made specifically for outdoor use, decorative plants, and no more than two grills.

Items **specifically prohibited** are clothing, laundry, or textiles. Additionally, no items at any time are permitted to hang over the floor or railing of the balcony with the exception of holiday lights. There shall be a rebuttable presumption that the owner of the real estate shall be liable under this provision.

Any owner, lessee, and/or occupant of the premise where the balcony is located who is in violation of this code will be issued a compliance ticket with a \$30.00 fee. If the violation is not corrected, a notice to appear or complaint will be issued for that violation resulting in the possibility of a fine of not less than \$75.00 if found guilty.

Enforcement of this ordinance began on December 1<sup>st</sup> following an informational campaign to make the effected people aware of the change in the municipal code. Residents in violation of the code, will be issued compliance notices that provide for ten (10) days to correct the violation. If the violation is not corrected after the ten (10) day period, a compliance ticket will be issued.

- Do not put trees in plastic bags.
- Remove the stand, decorations, lights, garland, tinsel, and metal (such as nails).
- Dispose of artificial or natural wreaths in regular household garbage.
- Do not place artificial trees at the curb for recycling.
- Set your tree out on the above dates. If you miss the special collection dates, Allied Waste Services will collect Christmas trees with your regular garbage and refuse collection.

This service is provided to homeowners associations not regularly serviced by Allied Waste Services.

# Community & Economic Development

## Economic Development Activities

The Community and Economic Development Department engages in several activities for furthering the goals of Economic Development, including Business Recruitment, Retention, and Redevelopment. Here are some examples:

- **CONNECT Committee:** We staff the Committee on Networking Education and Community, which is set up to voice the issues of the business community, facilitate networking opportunities and serve as a liaison between the Village and businesses. The Committee meets every 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of the month, at 12:30 p.m. in the Municipal Building. Businesses are welcome to attend, bring their concerns forward and provide feedback.
- **Business Receptions and After-hour events:** -The Village, in conjunction with the CONECT Committee and the Chamber organizes several networking events to promote our existing businesses. See Page 7 on recent and upcoming networking events.
- **List of Available Properties:** We keep an updated list of properties available for lease or sale and provide information to potential purchasers and developers at no cost. We attend various development events and use this tool to market the community. We also post this list on other regional websites for greater exposure.
- **Business Recruitment:** Staff meets with developers and brokers and attends various local, regional and national events for direct business recruitment. We prepare marketing materials for the Village overall and also for key development sites.
- **Ribbon Cuttings:** New businesses are offered the opportunity to hold a Ribbon Cutting ceremony attended by Village Elected Officials, CONECT and Chamber members and Village staff.
- **Mayor's Choice Awards:** Nominees for Business of the Year are accepted and considered for the Mayor's Choice Business of the Year Award.
- **Zoning Code Update:** We are currently updating various zoning regulations to promote streamlined development, consistent with best practices and improve our built environment.
